

# Online Module - Neonatal Clinical Pharmacology

### THE MODULE

- The lead module developer is Prof. Karel Allegaert in collaboration with Dr. Sinno Simons and Dr Anne Smits.
- This module will be delivered over a period of approximately 10 weeks. The core material will be accessible online via the Virtual Learning Environment.
- Synchronous and asynchronous online communication within trans-national student groups will promote collaborative discussion and debate relating to current neonatal care.

### PRE-REQUISITES

- You should be prepared to study at postgraduate level.
- You will need to be online for approximately 4 hours each week working throughout the module, in addition to the time for required reading.

### ACCESS OPTIONS

#### MSc option

- On successful completion of a module, 20 M Level credits/10 ECTS will be awarded.
- Summative assessment is integrated throughout each module.

#### Continuing professional development option

- You will follow the same curriculum as with the MSc, but there is no assessment or accreditation linked to this option.
- On completion of the module you will receive a certificate of attendance.
